| To foster links with secondary PE networks and employ specialist coaches to improve the quality of after-school sports ELO's | Forge links with PE specialists in local secondary schools Improved links with the Lancaster Academy and Sir Jonathan North Community College through active membership of the Leicester City School Sport and Physical Activity Network [SSPAN] and participation in a number of school and inter-school events and activities, e.g.: health and wellbeing leader training. | | Employ specialist coaches to deliver after-school ELO's A range of extended learning opportunities [ELO's] were offered to children across the school during the course of the school year. These included: Foundation Stage fun and games [Zheebz], KS1 multi sports [Football and Fitness] and KS2 street dance [Girls World]. The ELO's were very popular with both children and parents. | | Employ specialist football coach Following the unexpected departure of our regular specialist football coach due to a change in personal circumstances, we were unable to find a suitable replacement in time for the 2016-17 football season. | To expand the range and diversity of competitive sporting opportunities for children | Purchase affiliations to enable the school to participate in competitive sport The school's SSPAN affiliation provided a huge range of sporting opportunities last year with children competing in athletics, cross country, hockey and swimming to name just a few events. The school continued its membership of the Leicestershire and Rutland Schools Football Association, competing in both boys' and girls' leagues; we also took part in a Chance 2 Shine cricket competition. 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| | <p>Provide transport to sporting events</p> <p>Using the school's minibus to travel to and from the majority of sporting events kept costs low, maximising the number of opportunities we were able to provide for children. | To improve the school's sporting facilities | <p>Pay for the hire of St. Andrew's football ground</p> <p>In the absence of any playing fields of our own, St. Andrew's football ground continued to provide vital additional space for PE lessons and extra-curricular sport in 2016-17. It was used every week by the school football team; throughout the summer term for Year 5 and 6 PE lessons; and as the venue for our KS2 sports day. Contract to continue next year.</p> | £350 |
| | <p>Create an all-weather sports area by installing a canopy and laying Astroturf on part of the playground</p> <p>Midway through the year, plans began to be formulated to create an all-weather sports area by installing a canopy and laying Astroturf on part of the playground. With initial quotes indicating the significant cost of such a project, it was decided that part of the school's 2016-17 PE and Sport Premium should be set aside to help finance the exciting plans.</p> | £3,730 |
