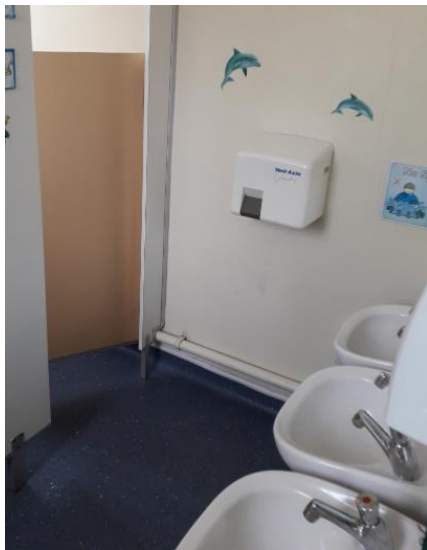
See if you can spot the Cubs on their travels...
